



Fruit Trees 2025

MALUS:(Apple) Two varieties are always needed for cross-pollination. Cross-pollination is possible only when varieties bloom at approximately the same time, see the list at the end for bloom times. Many of our selections are grafted on [semi-dwarf rootstock resulting in about a 15' tree and standard rootstock resulting in 20' tree](#). These semi-dwarf varieties will fruit earlier than standard rootstock types, often bearing within 4-5 years compared to 7-10 for many standard types.

Apples

Goodland-Zone 3 It produces large light green round apples with a red blush and white flesh which are usually ready for picking from late summer to early fall. The apples have a sweet taste and a juicy texture. Great for Eating and Cooking. **4-5 Months Storage** [#7 Gallon - \\$95.00](#)

Honeycrisp-Zone 4. It produces large red round apples with creamy white flesh which are usually ready for picking from early to mid-fall. The apples have a sweet taste and a crisp texture. Long Storage Life – up to 7 months. Great for Eating and Cooking. **6-7 Months Storage** [#7 Gallon - \\$95.00 & #10 Gallon - \\$150.00](#)

Macintosh-Zone 4 It produces red round hints of light green and white flesh which are usually ready for picking from early to mid-fall. The apples have a tart taste and a crisp texture. Eating, Cooking, Baking, Sauces. **5-7 M. Storage** [#5 Gallon - \\$80.00 & #10 Gallon - \\$150.00](#)

Frostbite -Zone 3 It produces small dark red apples with hints of gold and white flesh which are usually ready for picking from early to mid-fall. The apples have a sweet taste and a crisp texture. Eating and Juice-Making. **3 Months Storage** [#10 Gallon - \\$150.00](#)

Haralred -Zone 3 Haralred Apple is an improved version of [Haralson Apple](#). The fruit is redder and earlier than the standard 'Haralson' yet retains all the good qualities of 'Haralson': juicy, tart, firm, good keeper, extremely hardy. This variety holds its shape when cooked, but it's not suitable for applesauce. **4-5 Months Storage** [#7 Gallon - \\$95.00](#)

Red Wealthy -Zone 3 Red Wealthy is really, Wealthy in disguise. It is similar to Wealthy in every way except that the skin is darker red. It produces red round apples with hints of yellow and white flesh which are usually ready for picking from early to mid-fall. The apples have a sweet taste and a crisp texture. **2-3 Months Storage** [#7 Gallon - \\$95.00](#)

Wealthy-Zone 3 Wealthy produces red round apples with hints of yellow and white flesh which are usually ready for picking from early to mid-fall. The apples have a sweet taste and a crisp texture. Great for Eating, Baking, and Cooking. **1-2 Months Storage** [#7 Gallon - \\$95.00](#)

SnowSweet -Zone 4 The University of Minnesota introduced this cold hardy apple in 2006 and is a crosse between the Sharon and Connell Red apples. Its skin is red in color with slight vertical striping over a yellow-bronze hue. Fruit has a white, crisp flesh that's sweet, tasty and perfect for fresh eating. It is a later apple and should be left on the tree until fully ripe to develop its sweet and savory flavor. **2-3 Months Storage** [#7 Gallon - \\$95.00](#)

Sweet Sixteen -Zone 3 Sweet Sixteen Apple is a cross of Northern Spy and MN 447 (open-pollinated Malinda), Sweet Sixteen gets its cold hardiness from both parents. The apple is medium-large, blushed and striped rose-red, and speckled with pale lenticels. The flesh is crisp and distinctly yellow, almost golden. Fresh Eating, Cider, Desserts / Pies, Cooking / Sauces, Canning.

Zestar -Zone 4 Introduced in 1999 by the University of Minnesota as another cold hardy apple. The Zestar, also called Minnewashta, is a cross between the State Fair and MN 1691 apples. It is medium sized and ripens in August. Its skin is green that blushes to 60-85% red. Its flesh is white and crispy that tastes very sweet with notes of brown sugar. **1-2 Months Storage**

Gravenstein -Zone 4 Antique variety, originates from Denmark. Outstanding-quality dessert apple. Vigorous tree yields crops of medium fruit with red-over-green skin and creamy yellow flesh at maturity. Remarkable flavor when eaten fresh. Holds its shape when baked and makes excellent sauces. **1 Month Storage**

Haralson -Zone 4 Haralson apple was introduced in 1922 by the University of Minnesota. This variety produces large, tart apples that are very firm. They are excellent for pies and also for fresh eating for those who prefer eating hard, tart apples. Haralson apples hold their shape well when sliced and cooked in a pie. They do not mush up when cooked so are not great for applesauce but excellent for all other cooked products. **4-5 Months Storage**

Yellow Delicious -Zone 4/5 Yellow Delicious ripens late, developing a fine, sweet flavor. Best known as fresh-eating apples, yellow delicious also works well in the kitchen for pies, applesauce, and preserves. **3-6 Months Storage**

Red Delicious -Zone 4/5 Red Delicious produces large red apples with waxy skin and a pure white flesh. The Red Delicious apple has a very distinctive flavor and is firm, sweet, crisp and juicy. Good for fresh eating and baking. **3-6 Months Storage**

Kerr Crabapple -Zone 3 Kerr is a grafted crab introduced in 1952, a cross between the Dolgo and Haralson crab apples. Kerr crabapple is around 2" in size with a slightly tart but sweet taste that's good for fresh eating. They are also excellent for cooking, canning, jelly, cider, and juicing.

Early season bloomers: (in order of bloom)

Gravenstein, Frostbite, SnowSweet, Haralson, Red Wealthy, Wealthy,
Tasty Red, Blushing Delight, Zestar

Mid-Season bloomers: (in order of bloom)

Macintosh, Haralred, Goodland, Honeycrisp, Sweet Sixteen, Kerr, Red Delicious, Yellow Delicious

Columnar Apples in **#7 Container - \$125.00**

Blushing Delight – Upright Columnar – Zone 4 This variety produces green/yellow-colored apples that develop a red blush when ripe. The fruit is juicy and sweet. The columnar form makes it advantageous for those who have little space for growing fruit trees. **8-10' Tall by 2-3' Wide.**

Tasty Red – Upright Columnar – Zone 4 Tasty Red™ is a bright red, firm, sweet, juicy apple that ripens early mid-season. Urban® apples are NEW columnar trees that produce their fruit on spurs along the main stem. **8-10' Tall by 2-3' Wide.**

Peaches

PRUNUS:(Peach) Peaches are best suited to sites along Flathead Lake as they are only hardy to Zone 5 and can be marginal in any given winter. **All Peaches are Self-fruitful.**

Flamin' Fury -Zone 4/5. This variety set a world record for largest single peach — weighing in at more than 1½ pounds! You'll look like a peach expert when you plant this tree, enjoying impressive crops of red-blushed fruit season after season. Introduced circa 1996. Freestone. Ripens in early August. **#7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Reliance-Zone 4/5. Reliance Peach is an extremely cold hardy peach that was bred for northern climates. Considered to be one of the hardiest peach varieties. The fruit is soft, sweet, and very juicy. Medium-sized fruits are great for canning, cooking, and fresh eating. **#5 Gallon - \$80.00**

Contender - Zone 4/5. This exceptionally cold-hardy variety, perfect for northern gardens, consistently yields large crops of sweet, juicy, medium to large freestone fruit. Also features lovely flowers that bloom in spring. Ripens in mid to late August. **#7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Pears

PYRUS: (Pear) Pears can live to be old trees and these are standard trees that will stay under 20'. They are upright growers. Occasionally may drop significant fruit prior to harvest.

These varieties will pollinate each other so you must plant two trees (One of each variety).

Parker -Zone 3. Parker pear was developed by the University of Minnesota and released in 1934. The fruits are medium-sized, green, and often develop a slight red blush on the sunny side of the fruit. While most pears need to be picked at the green/ripe stage and then slow ripened off the tree, Parker seems to be ok when picked fully tree-ripened as it does not have many issues with core rot like other pear varieties. Large, yellow bronze fruit. Fine grained, tender, and juicy.

Patten -Zone 4. Patten is a rather large pear, typically pear-shaped with a very long stalk. The skin is thin and light-yellow green in color, with brown lenticels, and the flesh is white. The pear is one of the last pears to ripen, being ready to harvest at the end of September. **#5 Gallon - \$80.00**

Summercrisp -Zone 4 Summercrisp pear was released by the University of Minnesota in the 1980's. It is a very cold hardy variety that is a prolific producer of small, crispy pears (3"-3.5" fruits) that are good for fresh eating only. A unique pear as it is best picked and consumed at the green/ripe stage when the fruit is crispy and not fully ripe. The fruit quality decreases rapidly if allowed to fully ripen. Stores for up to 3 weeks refrigerated. **#5 Gallon - \$80.00 & #7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Cherries

PRUNUS:(Cherry) These are rewarding to grow for both their sweet blossoms and delicious fruit. They vary widely for hardiness. You may need to protect your crop from birds because they can be greedy and beat you to it. **All Cherries are Self-fruitful.**

Evans Bali Semi Sweet -Zone 3 Sweet-tart cherry with fruit 1" in diameter. Fruit is much sweeter than other sour cherries. A self-fertile variety and very cold hardy. **#7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Lapin -Zone 4. After the big freeze of 1989-90, many Flathead cherry growers switched to this Canadian selection, reputed to be hardier and more resistant to splitting. The crop has been harvested for many years now and the verdict is that these compete favorably with the old variety, P. 'Lambert'. **#7 Gallon - \$95.00 & #10 Gallon - \$150.00**

Montmorency Pie –Zone 4 A tart cherry for pies or preserves. These are small trees to start and at maturity, they will reach 15-18' by 15-18' wide. **#7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Stella –Zone 4. An old standby Sweet and productive cherry. This tree bears plump, bold-red cherries, heart-shaped fruit. Also suitable for canning, freezing and drying to enjoy later. Resists cracking and is moderately disease-resistant. Developed in Summerland, British Columbia and introduced in 1968. Ripens in June. **#7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Plums

PRUNUS:(Plum) Relatively easy to grow, fresh plums are a real treat.

Black Ice –Zone 3 Is a cross between a cherry plum and a conventional Japanese dessert plum. The plums produced are adored for their dark red skin, red flesh, and sweet taste – perfect for baking, preserves, or fresh eating. [Pollinate with Toka.](#)

Toka –Zone 3 Toka, also known as Bubblegum Plum, is one of the best pollinators of all the plums. The skin is reddish bronze, with richly flavored, spicy sweet, apricot-colored flesh. This hardy tree is moderately vigorous and produces heavy crops that ripen in late August into September.

Mount Royal – Zone 4 Known to be one of the best blue plums. Good for fresh eating, processing, or drying. The plums that are harvested in late Summer are freestone, blue skinned, and have a firm yellow flesh. **Self-fruitful.** **#5 Gallon - \$80.00**

Superior –Zone 4 Proving its name since 1933, this very hardy Asian-American hybrid from Minnesota remains a favorite both for flavor and for toughness! The very large fruit has true red skin and delicious, meaty, yellow flesh. The tree bears a heavy crop of heart-shaped, clingstone fruit at an early age. Italian Prune –Zone 4 Famous worldwide for reliability and heavy setting, Italian Prune plum is a large purple freestone plum with yellow-green flesh. Great for drying and canning due to their sweet and firm flesh, these plums are also great for fresh eating. **Self-fruitful.** **#7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Apricots

PRUNUS: (Apricot) Both varieties we offer are grafted on dwarf rootstock, keeping their mature size under 15'. The varieties we offer pollinate each other well.

Moongold - -Zone 3 Firm and sweet with delightful flavor. Golden-colored fruit is medium in size with an attractive, orange-yellow flesh. Freestone fruit makes for easy preserves and is perfect for fresh snacking. [Pollinate with Sungold](#) **#7 Gallon - \$95.00**

Sungold - -Zone 3. Sungold Apricot is a medium-sized tree that is typically grown for its edible qualities. It produces gold round fruit with a orange blush and orange flesh which are usually ready for picking in mid summer. The fruits have a sweet taste and a juicy texture. [Pollinate with Moongold](#)
